Sam is a veteran federal trial lawyer who has tried more than twenty cases to verdict. He specializes in antitrust litigation and has been ranked in *Chambers USA* since 2021 for his accomplishments in the field. Sam’s practice focuses primarily on prosecuting claims for companies that have been victims of domestic and international price-fixing conspiracies. Sam has assisted clients in obtaining substantial recoveries from cartels in a wide variety of industries including polyurethane foam, eggs, cathode ray tubes, packaged seafood, lithium ion batteries, and broiler chickens.

Sam joined Kenny Nachwalter in 2013 after serving as an Assistant Federal Public Defender and as a law clerk for the Honorable Adalberto Jordan in the Southern District of Florida. Sam has also taught evidence as an adjunct professor at the University of Miami.

**REPRESENTATIVE CASES**

- In *In re Cathode Ray Tube Antitrust Litigation*, MDL No. 1917, Northern District of California, Sam represented two of the largest retailers in the country to recover damages from a cartel involving the largest consumer electronics manufacturers in the world. The case settled one month before trial began, after Sam’s clients prevailed on more than 25 case-dispositive motions filed by the defendants.

- In *In re Polyurethane Foam Antitrust Litigation*, MDL No. 2196, Northern District of Ohio, Sam represented the largest bedding and furniture manufacturers in the country to recover damages from a cartel of polyurethane foam manufacturers. The case settled less than one month before trial, after Sam's clients prevailed on every case-dispositive motion for summary judgment filed by the defendants.
